- Total of \$33,500 in income and expenditures
- Annual budget for printing and mailing is biggest expense, & we must send physical newsletter as chapter of National Audubon
 - Has been more expensive this year since we tried out color printing
- Grants are estimated from last year & website hosting and Zoom costs change year to year
- Lincoln Center and Schmeeckle have waived room fees for us this year
- Would like to add line item for donor designated contributions under income
 - Keep track of how that money is used
- Would like to add line item for WIX credit card transaction fees under expenditures
 - Look into potentially passing off fee costs to purchasers or have fees waived as nonprofit?

• Propose Changes

- Move CWES camper scholarship from university scholarship line item to discretionary donations
- Add \$500 line item for donor designated contributions under income
- Add \$500 line item for WIX credit card transaction fees under expenditures

 - Juvenile loon rescued from fishing line
 - o Two juveniles released on lake and two later found dead
 - Canada Goose had died on loon nesting platform; suspected to have bird flu
 - o Karen D. working on writing a grant for signage at Sunset Lake

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Birdseed Sale Update

- **Final Tally** 89 preorders totaling roughly \$11,000; almost 450 items; 75% of orders made online.
- Comparison to Last Year 81 preorders; 387 items; 66% of orders made online.
- Suggestions
 - Waiting to hear back from Midge on whether more volunteers are needed next year
 - o In future, could partner with campus students doing bird research

Google Folders-Issues?

- Everyone should have correct permissions
- Some issues, Amiee's access mostly fixed

Window Collision Project

- Safe Passage for Birds Program Began partnership in 2022
 - Our student point person, Molly, had project identifying which buildings on UWSP campus are most dangerous for birds
- Bird Safe Window Treatments on Chem Bio Building
 - Molly's project identified the worst building as the CBB; window treatment for this would cost about \$42,000
 - She had drafted a grant proposal the application of the window treatments, but has graduated and since this needs to be submitted by a student, this project needs to be revisited

- University facilities manager supportive of staff helping prep windows for installation
- New Library and HEC Building Renovations
 - The university has installed bird safe glass as part of these projects.

Education (Bob L.)

- Approved grant last spring for virtual school at CWES
 - Will be working on a few different kinds of bird houses for kids to put together
 - Bob could use volunteers to work on them and speak on birds & nesting on November 25th around 11 a.m.
- Continuing to send out letters about grant opportunities
- Partnering with a woman in Amherst who has money to contribute to local schools for bird and habitat improvement projects

Conservation (Rob P.)

- Endangered and threatened species seen on bird walks
 - Endangered: black tern
 - Threatened: upland sand piper, Henslow's sparrow, greater prairie chicken
- Menomonie Data center update:
 - o \$1.6 billion data center
 - City council voted yes to rezone land for development, but center will only 50-75 permanent jobs and use 75,000 gallons of water every day
 - Mayor says won't pursue development agreement; Mayor has veto power over council votes
